The program aims to use volunteer service dogs to provide company, affection and unconditional love to patients, caregivers and hospital employees in the way only a loveable pooch can. Studies have shown that spending time with animals can increase positive mood, decrease loneliness, anxiety, depression and stress, and help temporarily shift a patient's focus away

from any pain they may be experiencing. With two new canine volunteers and their owners trained, tested and credentialed with their very own Montefiore IDs, the P.E.T. program officially kicks off February 15. Both the dogs and their owners will be under direct supervision of Montefiore staff at all times during their visits.

The Annual Review must be completed each year by all associates, with completion records tracked and monitored. Associates hired in the current calendar year will receive similar information as part of their New Associate Orientation and therefore will not need to complete the Annual Review online this year. In addition, providers are sent the Provider Version and therefore do not need to complete the Annual Review in Talent Management.

For most associates, the Annual Review has been assigned and will appear on their "To Do" list as a requirement. Associates will need to select the correct version (Clinical, Non-clinical, Home Health Care Clinical or Home Health Care Non-clinical).
