Montefiore Adopts ICD-10

eginning October 1, 2015, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services will require the use of ICD-10, a new medical coding language. ICD-10 will improve the specificity of diagnosis reporting and will change the way Montefiore practices, documents and bills.

Montefiore is currently looking for early adopters of Epic@Montefiore to also be early adopters of ICD-10, beginning in July. Epic possesses functionality that is helpful in working with ICD-10, and early adoption will ensure that the health system is ready by October. Everyone associated with the revenue cycle process and with documentation in the medical record will need to undergo some level of training in ICD-10 to understand ICD-10 language and its impact on the documentation of Montefiore's patients' diagnoses. Epic@Montefiore Expands to Specialty Practices

Since Epic@Montefiore's initial go-live at CMO, Montefiore Care Management, Montefiore Medical Group (MMG), Occupational Health Services (OHS) and Sound Shore Cardiology Associates sites in May, the new integrated electronic health record system will now be deployed to clinicians, front desk, and operational associates at more than 80 specialty ambulatory care locations throughout the health system. To accommodate the increased number of associates and Super Users who require training in integrated workflow areas such as cardiology, neurology, oncology, OB-GYN and rehabilitation, both self-registration and formal sessions to assist associates with registration are available. In addition to the Epic@Montefiore training site, located at the Westchester Square Campus, a newly renovated training facility on Gun Hill Road in the Bronx will provide associates with a location close to the Moses Campus.

Specialized training for nearly 400 Super Users will begin June 1–12. General associate training begins between June 15 and July 24. Super Users played an integral role during Epic@Montefiore's initial go-live, serving as a key resource in helping their peers familiarize themselves with the system. Super Users will again serve as a vital resource in helping to implement phase two of the Epic go-live.
