Montefiore Supports Healthy Relationships

ontefiore's Supporting Healthy Relationships program, designed to enhance and strengthen the relationships of low-income families in the Bronx, has received renewed funding from the Administration for Children and Families (ACF), a division of the Department of Health & Human Services. The program is managed through Montefiore's University Behavioral Associates (UBA), a behavioral management organization founded by the Departments of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at Montefiore and Einstein.

"People who lack financial resources can require couples counseling as much as any couple with resources," says Jantra Coll, PsyD, Program Director, Supporting Healthy Relationships, UBA/Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences, Montefiore. "The problem is a lack of access because of long wait lists or prohibitive costs. And there is a stigma surrounding the need for help." Supporting Healthy Relationships offers a free workshop, "Strengthen Your Relationship," to qualifying families.

Led by psychologists and mental health counselors, couples with children, as well as pregnant women and their partners, are given the opportunity to develop skills that could help them achieve greater family and financial stability. "We offer communication and conflict management skills, counseling to couples in distress and employment services to help the unemployed and underemployed," Dr. Coll says.

Participants are required to attend weekly sessions for approximately nine weeks. They could be eligible for childcare reimbursement and MetroCard discounts. Since its inception in 2006, nearly 2,000 couples have participated in the program.

To qualify, both partners must be at least 18 years old, be in a committed relationship, and have at least one child under 18 living at home or be expecting a child.
